

Again, I pledge to give you my individual attention and deal with you as I prefer to be dealt with.

Lay A way: For a 10% deposit I'll hold any knife, or knives, for you for up to four months. There is no charge for this service, but please keep your account active with partial payments. Order will be shipped upon final payment. I feel this will enable anyone to purchase a fine knife.

Special Orders. If you prefer a Randall variation that isn't listed please inform me and I'll be happy to include it with my usual order. In most cases the delivery time is 6 to 10 weeks. Include 10% deposit.



All other orders will be sent postpaid within the U.S. If you prefer airmail (recommended for Alaska and Hawaii) please include extra for additional charge. If you are in a rush for a knife and want me to send it C.O.D. please figure \$2.00 extra. Conn. residents please figure the present sales tax and include half of this amount with your order... I'll pay the other half. To assure prompt delivery please send certified check or money order. Your personal check is acceptable but will delay shipment.






Model #1 "All-Purpose Fighting Knife" 7"



## RUANA HOLLOW GROUND HANDCRAFTED KNIVES

These knives are made by a combination of handcraft processes and the use of modern power tools. The blades are made of the finest Hi-Carbon spring steel, forged with a modern power hammer, free hand hollowground, individually oil quenched and heat treated. The handles are made of aluminum, cast directly on the tang, with native Montana elk horn inserts beveled and riveted.

This type of knife has proven satisfactory for over 41 years, and if kept properly sharpened will give years of good cutting service.

Standard and De Luxe models are both made of the same materials, same care in workmanship, only the designs are different.

**BATTLE BOWIE:** A more traditional bowie shaped fighter on the largest practical scale. Maintains the cutting capacity of the Battle Dirk, with the sharpened top edge and keeps the point in line with the handle to insure accuracy when delivering the thrust. The sub-hilt is again added for security and control.

**BATTLE DIRK:** This grind combines the strength and slashing ability of the spearpoint with the thrusting superiority of the stiletto, and is acknowledged to be the **best and most efficient** shape for close-quarter, hand-to-hand combat.

**MARAUDER COMBAT BOWIE:** Another fighter suggested for military service with the popular modified bowie shaped blade. With the sharpened top edge and slightly dropped point, this weapon works well in combat when "slash and thrust" fighting techniques are employed.

**ASSASSIN COMBAT STILETTO:** Strictly a thrusting weapon not meant to be used for the slashing type of knife attack. The blade is ground for lightning like penetration. The top of the handle is also lethal, being reinforced with stainless steel and shaped for delivering "skull crusher" blows.

**RAIDER ATTACK COMBAT BOOT:** The perfect mate for the CRAWFORD Marauder Combat Bowie. The Raider Attack shares the same tapered tang and double hollow ground construction as its bigger brother. **THUNDER STRIKE COMBAT BOOT:** This boot is similar to the Raider Attack, but features a slimmer blade 3/4" wide.






**SHAFT:** Another superb thrusting boot. This model was adapted from the Model 1917 Trench Knife.




**GAME GETTER DROP POINT:** A no-nonsense design that drops the spine slightly to provide some point with an excellent belly forward skinning curve.

## Bill Bagwell

### Master Knifesmith




Bill Bagwell first began turning out hand-forged knives in 1970, and while he attracted considerable nation-wide publicity through such publications as GUNSPORT, GUN WEEK, GUNS, GUN WORLD, THE AMERICAN BLADE, etc., he was dissatisfied with his work. From approximately 1974 to 1975 Bagwell made only a few dozen knives, devoting his time to studying and improving his product.

In early 1976 Bagwell finally achieved the high degree of perfection, both in terms of appearance and performance, that he had been attempting to reach. In spite of his layoff as a full-time cutler, it should be noted that he was, during this time span, one of only two smiths offering genuine Damascus steel blades.

#### DAMASCUS STEEL

Speaking in very general terms, Damascus steel is essentially alternating layers of iron and steel hammered welded together. This process is repeated time and again until the bar of steel may contain as many as 2048 layers. The amount of time and energy required to produce such a blade is staggering. Many hunting-size blades require as much as 400 pounds of coal!

The result is a blade that has a distinct pattern, which the smith may, if he has the ability, direct and control. The finished blade will hold an edge in a fashion superior to the very finest of today's high carbon tool steels, yet a blade made of Damascus is extremely flexible and it requires little effort to resharpen when it finally becomes dull.



FIGHTING KNIFE

*Bill's production is limited but usually have a dozen or more knives on hand, half of which are Damascus. He prefers to make the knife as you want it rather than a standard model. Being his exclusive dealer service is usually prompt, although military orders are filled first. Bill is a member of the American Blacksmiths Society.*
